SHORT HISTORY OF FOXTON

The history of Foxton goes back to the Early Iron Age, but the original settlement was about 260 yards north of the railway crossing on the Foxton-Barrington road. Remains found in 1920 prove this. A very beautiful chalice of Arretin ware was found in the same area in 1852.

The district was thickly populated in Anglo-Saxon times. For many years there was a great feud between Foxton on the one side of the river and Barrington on the other, for in Saxon times the river divided the two great kingdoms of Anglia and Mercia. In 1327 the parsons of Foxton and Barrington fought it out.

About 1260 the Mortimer family started to hold land in Foxton, and the evidence of this is now to be found in the moated Mortimer's Farm. In 1310 Constantine de Mortimer was granted a charter for a Yearly Fair and later, from 1326, a weekly market was held in the village. Another large estate was where the Burlington Press now stands.

The church (partly dating from the 13th century) has an interesting history. The beautiful silver chalice, with the date 1569 on the lid, was probably presented by Elizabeth I as a "conscience cup" to atone for her father's depredations.

The main London road did not pass through Foxton, but through Fowlmere. The railway almost gave the village a miss too. The Great Northern Company came as far as Shepreth by 1851. A rival company, the Great Eastern, secured the rights, in 1852, to build a railway from Cambridge to Shepreth, but for 14 years the Great Northern ran coaches from Shepreth to Cambridge, the journey taking 40 minutes. The line was electrified in 1988.

In 1086 the Domesday Book gave the population as 237, while at the census of 1951 the figure was 567. Today it is approaching 1200.

The Bury, belonging to the Abbey of Chatteris which, according to the Domesday Book, owned about 640 acres in the village, formed, together with the Church, the centre of the village in the 11th century.

The printing works were established in 1908. This proved a boon to a depressed village. Forty men and women were employed there.

Street lighting was first discussed in 1913 but was not installed until 1954.

The local development plan designates Foxton as a village where only limited small scale development will normally be permitted. In the 1960s and 1970s two new estates were built — Illingworth Way/St Laurence Road and West Hill. In 2001 a development was completed centred on a new village hall and primary school overlooking the Recreation Ground. It also included about 30 residential houses on the newly formed Hardman Road and Edis Way. The Village Hall enjoyed a substantial grant from the Millennium Commission. Within this development was a plan to replace allotments taken for the site of the buildings. This eventually became a reality in 2007 with the first sod turned on May 3.

Foxton Town Lands Charity

The origins of the Charity can be traced back to 1671 when parcels of land in Cambridgeshire were granted to individuals for charitable purposes. Since the last century, and probably before, Foxton's land, which is situated in Fowlmere Road, was used as allotments, the rent from which was used to provide coal for the "poor and needy of the village". In 1970 the terms of the charity were varied to include a wide range of benefits that can be provided for parishioners who, in the opinion of the trustees, qualify. The land, comprising approx. 6.5 acres, is presently cultivated by a local farmer. It is the rent from this land that finances the charity.

VILLAGE SERVICES**Refuse Collection**

Collection is made each Friday, except when a Bank Holiday occurs in the week, when collection is on Saturday. Recycling is actively encouraged; the green box should be used for glass, tins and newspaper (separated by placing some in plastic bags); the green wheelie bin should be used for all compostable material; plastic is not collected from the doorstep but there are recycling bins at most supermarket car parks; only non-recyclable waste should be placed in the black wheelie bin. Collection is alternately green bin and box one week then black bin the following Friday. The bins should be placed near to, but not on, the highway early on the day of collection. The Council's recycling centre at Thriplow is available to residents to dispose of items not taken by the regular collections, eg hardcore, timber, metal, refrigerators, clothing, cardboard.
